
What is Converge?

There are four Challenges tailored to different sectors and stages, so it doesn't matter if your business idea is at an early stage or fully fledged - we can help you take it to the next level.





For the best innovation in the industrial biotechnology space. £20k cash prize for the university where the project originated plus a package of support.




What does it cost?


If you're successful, you'll become a member of our 2024 cohort congratulations - and will receive more detailed information about the training programme.
